KISS AND DROP ZONE – AVONDALE STREET

In recent weeks we have received reports of congestion and parents not adhering to the rules of our Kiss and Drop Zone in Avondale Street. As this is the main entrance for our students to enter the school we remind all families of the following.

TURNING CIRCLE

Cars are required to drive to the end of the cul-de-sac and turn around before entering the Kiss and Drop Zone. **It is illegal and also dangerous for cars to complete a U Turn in the School Crossing Zone.**

NO PARKING AREA:

This is a 'kiss and drop' zone only and cars cannot linger in this area for more than 2 minutes and you must remain within 3 metres of your vehicle.

NO STOPPING AREA

Vehicles are not permitted to stop in this area for any reason, it is an allocated children's crossing zone.

These zones are effective between 8.00 am and 9.30 am and again 2.30 pm and 4.00 pm on all school days, including Pupil Free Days.



Please note that the Council ranger and Police have been notified of this constant cause of concern and have advised they will be monitoring the area.

I am sure all would agree that student safety is paramount and we are to act in a manner that is nothing but an exemplary model for our children.
